Cllr J Lonergan reported on a recently held meeting at County Hall to discuss Police amalgamation. The local submission that Notts, Derbys and Leicestershire be combined was overruled in favour of the Central Government 5 force option (also included Northampton and Lincolnshire) Local estimates of costs were considerably higher than those of the Government and it was expected that any difference would be borne by local tax payers. It was expected that the five force option would be imposed.

Invitations had been received to attend meetings of the Building Better Communities Initiatives and of the Travelwatch (to discuss the new Rail franchises). It was agreed not to accept either of the invitations.

Following the introduction of the “Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act 2005” Defra has offered to supply a detailed guide to the new regulations. The clerk was asked to request a copy.

A request had been received from the Local Channel to create links the Parish Website.

It was agreed to decline on the basis that no benefits would accrue.
