Parishioners have asked for contact details of the Parish Councillors, these are available on our website and on the village notice boards located on Linby Lane (near the bus stop), Moor Road (opposite the top of Papplewick Lane) and Mansfield Road (on the fence on the Severn Trent station)

The 'triangle' outside the gates to Papplewick Hall has had a new bench, fence and no parking signs installed, although cars are still parking outside the entrance to Papplewick Hall. Please remember that access is needed to the farm and houses on Hall Lane at all times. If anyone has information about the tree on the 'triangle', i.e. when it was planted and what was the occasion, please let the clerk know.

Complaints have been made to the council about garden bonfires. Please be considerate to your neighbours and light bonfires after 6.30pm.

Please be aware that haystacks have been targeted at two farms in our area and have suffered arson attacks. If you see anything suspicious please contact the police.

The Parish Council are submitting a grant to Building Better Communities early in 2010 for new signposting at Hall Lane suggesting that the lay-bys in the village and on Blidworth Way are used for car parking.

We will also be submitting grants to Building Better Communities for drainage and new 'outside gym' equipment on the park.

Graffiti continues to blight the apparatus on the park. The Parish Council have asked the police to bring a criminal damage prosecution on teenagers who have defaced the new slide. If anyone has further information, or knows any of the youngsters who are causing the damage please call the police and forward the crime number to the Parish Clerk. You may be interested to know that every Parish Councillor has a two month 'stint' in which they are responsible for keeping the equipment in good order, tidying the field and notifying the clerk of any damage that needs rectifying. Building Better Communities Bids

After four successful bids through the BBC scheme, Linby Parish Council are currently working on the following projects.

1. Hayden Lane

Work will commence during October to resurface 'old' Hayden Lane with rolled stone. Appropriate signs to discourage drivers from using this route unnecessarily will also be erected. It is hoped that these measures will reduce some of the anti social behaviour experienced in the past.

2. Community Notice Board

A Community Notice Board has been commissioned and will be placed at the entrance of Quarry Lane. Both the Parish Council, School and Church as well as any local groups are welcome to use this board to make people aware of news and events in the local area.

3. Sculpture

After consulting the village on what type of sculpture people would like to see sited on the roundabout at the top of Main Street, the ideas put forward have been discussed with a local artist. His proposal will be brought back for the council's approval November. Thank you to all those who responded to our questionnaire, your feedback was greatly appreciated.

4. Heritage Centre Planting

The meadow surrounding the Heritage Centre has been redesigned and is currently being planted in phases by Naturescape. Features will include a primrose bank and local wild flowers which will increase the wildlife in the meadow.

Linby Parish Council will be hosting our annual Carol Concert on Monday 14th December at 7.00pm. As well as the beautiful tree, Christmas lights and carols, there will also be a local band, mulled wine and mince pies! We hope you can join us for this special community event.
