Councillor Vacancy

We have a vacancy for a Parish Councillor in Papplewick, interested ? Asking yourself, 'Am I Qualified ?

The answer is **yes**, most people are. However, there are a few rules ...

- * you have to be a British subject, or a citizen of the Commonwealth or the European Union and,
- * on the 'relevant day' (i.e. the day on which you are nominated or if there is a poll on the day of election) be 18 years or older and.
- * on the relevant day be a local government elector for the council are for which you wish to stand, or,
- * have during the whole 12 months preceding that day occupied as owner or tenant any land or premises in the council area, or,
- * have during that same period had your principal or only place of work in the council area, or,
- * during that 12 month period resided in the council area.

but,

You cannot stand for election if you

- * are subject of a bankruptcy restriction order or interim order,
- * have, within 5 years before the day of election been convicted in the UK of any offence and have had a sentence of imprisonment (whether suspended or not) for a period of over 3 months without the option of a fine,
- * you work for the council you want to become a councillor for (but you can work for other local authorities, including the principal authorities that represent the same area).

Parish Council

Church Lane grit bin

The new salt bin for Church Lane has arrived. Mr Stretton, of Papplewick Lodge, has kindly offered to site the new bin next to his car park. There is a second salt bin ordered for siting next to the gates leading to St James' Church, kindly agreed by Reverend Turner.

<u>Precept</u>

It was agreed at the recent finance meeting and the following full meeting of the Parish Council that the precept be raised from last years £6011 by £754. This figure was agreed based on the budget for next year using the current year's figures, and anticipated expenditure. To ensure the agreed 2010/11 budget of £11501 remains as agreed it therefore means that the Precept will be £6765. This equates to an actual rise for parishioners from £21.69 per annum to £24.52.

Highways Matters

Cllr Murphy and Cllr Barnfather have attended a meeting with members of the Parish Council with a view to finding a solution to the traffic jams at both Forest Lane and Blidworth Waye junctions with the A60. Also the Accident Investigation is constantly monitoring the situation and will keep the Parish Council and the County Councillors informed of any progress as and when it occurs.

Hall Lane island

Parking is still an issue on the Hall Lane island. Cars are still blocking the lane, parking on the grass verge outside Top Farm and the junction with Main Street outside Papplewick Hall. Finger posts are to direct car drivers to the village and the lay-bys on Blidworth Waye for parking. A small notice board, to compliment the finger post will be sited on the island near the bench.

Bulb Planting

There are still snowdrops to move in the woods and a grow-bag of garlic will need to be transplanted in clumps. Cllr. Roberts has asked to be notified of any 'gaps' in plants around the parish ready for the autumn planting.

Playing Field/Park Update



Papplewick Parish Council has recently installed a CCTV camera covering it's Playing Field & Park. It is hoped that it will be a deterrent to any anti-social behaviour on the park in the future.

Health & Social-Wellbeing Partnership Grant Awarded to Papplewick!

Papplewick Parish Council is continuing it's improvements of the facilities on the Playing Field and

Park. In January 2010 it was successful in being awarded £4,281 towards the purchase of two pieces of outdoor gym equipment geared towards use by older people. The new equipment is a Xerscape Space Walker and a Xerscape Skier. We hope you enjoy having a go, and let us know what you think by emailing the Parish Clerk at clerk@papplewick.org

The Papplewick & Linby Leisure Enterprise Group are also funding a new Inclusive Oribit Roundabout to replace the old and worn slide. Works are expected to take place in the next 8 to 10 weeks.

Moor Pond Wood

The Friends of Moor Pond Wood would like to thank Kevin Gilbert of Altham Lodge who has very kindly made a generous donation towards the Moor Pond Wood project. This will either be used towards further archaeology or towards the making of a case for the model of the site which has been created by Robin Barton in memory of his wife Wendy. By kind permission of the Village Hall. Committee the model will be located in the Village Hall.

At the meeting of the Moor Pond Wood Steering Group the matter of the 'Greater Nottingham Aligned Core Strategy' consultation was raised. The councils which make up Greater Nottingham are proposing a strategy which will allow development of the land previously 'safeguarded for further development' by Gedling in their 2004-2015 development plan.

In brief, they propose development of up to 600 houses in the fields between the Vaughan Estate and Moor Pond Woods, possibly with a road access to Papplewick Lane. This will clearly have an impact on the quality of life and the environment of Papplewick and its residents, even though the development is officially within Linby parish.

The likely impact could be:-

- 1. Increased traffic on Papplewick Lane, Moor Road and probably at the village crossroads.
- 2. An impact of top water flow into the River Leen, and therefore impact on water quality and particularly species such as crayfish and water voles which live in the river.
- 3. Increased visitor impact on the project area.
- 4. Impact on habitats in Moor Pond Wood, which is a SINC, because many of the species which live in the project area have territory which stretches into the Leen Corridor.
- 5. Visual impact on the project area.

There are grounds to object on all of these points.
