The Council is aware of further incidents of anti-social behaviour on the playing field and the Village Hall car-park. It is important that we work together to keep the facilities safe and usable. It is worth remembering that CCTV operates on the field. If you have any concerns about anti-social behaviour (but the circumstances are not an emergency) or to report a crime that has already happened, you should use the non-emergency numbers 101 or 112.

Action Fraud received over 100 reports last week about fake emails purporting to be from TalkTalk. The emails state that the recipient's TalkTalk account is in credit and that they're owed a refund. The links in the emails lead to malicious websites.

Early in Spring there were several break-ins, targeting sheds and the theft of portable equipment. The criminals have applied considerable force and determination to break through/ cut numerous locks. Please make sure that your valuables are secure, and contact the police if you witness any suspicious behaviour or are 'a victim.

The Defibrillator

There is a Defibrillator available at the Village Hall, and one at the Pumping Station during Opening Hours.

The machine is fully automatic with a simple two-step process that gives the first person to respond to a cardiac arrest the confidence they need to help save a life. A responder only needs to turn on the device and apply the

electrode pads to the victim. The fully automatic nature of the machine is designed to deliver a shock only if it determines that a heart needs it. No one even needs to press a 'shock' button.

The defibrillator is located in the Village Hall porch, on the right hand side, in a bright yellow container. It is available for use by any member of the community. It can only be accessed and used after obtaining a code from EMAS when dialling 999. The code received unlocks the key safe at the side of the yellow box. Please replace the key after use.

Council News

Since the last newsletter the Local Authority elections have taken place. Most members of the Parish Council were willing to stand again, and were elected unopposed. However, there is now a vacancy on the council. If you have some time to spare and would be willing to help out in your community please get in touch for more information.

In the last few months a serious concern has been expressed about the poor state of the roads and pavements around the village, and the pavements alongside Mansfield Road. Issues such as poor drainage, (flooding at times), weed growth, poor surfaces and general untidiness have all been reported. The community has some time from the 'Lengthsman' who is paid to carry out odd -jobs in the parish, and he will be directed to address some of the small problems

We have organised site meetings with NCC and GBC to discuss other issues, particularly the Flooding on Blidworth Waye, and the apparent lack of street cleaning. We hope that you will notice an improvement in the coming weeks.

Papplewick Environment and Community Fund

The Marshall family are donating £2000 per year from the income generated by the Barracks wind turbine into a fund to improve the local environment.

The fund is administered by a Council Working Party. Funding applications can be made by any person or group who have an idea which will benefit the community by improving the environment. In the first year of the scheme, the Council has agreed to fund additional planters to brighten the appearance of the parish. If you would like to know more about the fund and how it is administered, please contact the Clerk.

If you have a good idea about an environmental project that would have a community benefit please let us know. The working party will meet in September 2019 to agree what plans can be made for the next round of funding.

Making the Neighbourhood Plan a reality....



The successful adoption of the Neighbourhood Plan in 2018 opens up the next phase of the project. Councillors have begun discussions about writing an Action Plan, to put into effect the aspirations which were expressed in the plan. A copy of the adopted plan is available on the Council website.

In 2018, we entered the Nottinghamshire Best Kept Village competition, but were not chosen for the second round. We are making further improvements. We have ordered plants to boost the floral displays in the planters, and additional planters have been installed at some of the entrances to the parish. We hope to install additional planters on Main Street. We held two successful 'Tidy-up' events last year The Council has agreed to hold further events this year, see inside for more detail.

Roadworks—Moor Road and Papplewick Lane

We have been advised that Papplewick Lane will be closed or have restricted access during resurfacing work in the week beginning June 17th, this will obviously cause disruption. Watch out for signs. We understand that a new roundabout will be installed at the Moor Road / Papplewick Lane junction at around the same time. This has not been confirmed, but be aware that this is likely to be taking place in June.

Moor Pond Woods Project

The group is in the process of applying for money from various sources towards upgrading the paths around Papplewick Dam Wood. Improved ramped access from the layby has been created, to the benefit all users. but particularly those with pushchairs or limited mobility. The next phase will be to relay the paths near the fishing pond and replace the footbridge over the river. Some bank-work is needed near the waterfall, to prevent further erosion.
