# **OPEN FORUM**

PCSO Joe Partlett provided an update of the latest crime figures for Papplewick. Only five crimes had been reported including the theft of a Royal Mail Van. Car related offences at public houses were now reducing due primarily to improved car park lighting. Such crimes were now taking place at lunchtimes.

Mrs Sue Sale, Head of Democratic & Community Services at Gedling BC advised the meeting of the new standards requirements for members as laid down in the revised Code of Conduct. Under the revised code Mrs Sale is the monitoring officer for Gedling BC and all Parish Councils in the borough. (LGA Act 2000)

A major change is that the code applies to Parish Council Members only when acting in their capacity as councillors. The one exception to this rule is where a criminal conviction applies. Prejudicial interest rules have also been revised and now only apply where interests are either financial or regulatory. Confidentiality issues between councillors and "friends" is now relaxed to cover only relationships where there is deemed to be close association. Discussions outside the Council must be shown to be in good faith, responsible and in the public interest

Complaints or breaches of the regulations are now dealt with by standards Committee set up by Gedling BC.

There have been complaints of dog fouling in the woods. NCC are negotiating a longer term management contract with the Coop with the objective of securing access to more grants and other sources of funding.

Surface flood water is accumulating on Moor Road adjacent to the woods. It thought that this is surface water coming form the woodland due to excessive rainfall.

Cllr Roberts has asked Stephen Walker (chair of the MPW steering group) about planting the more bulbs both in the woods and along adjacent verges. Cllr Mrs S Andrews (GBC) has some funding available that could be used for this purpose.

New interpretation boards are anticipated to be installed within the next2/3 months.
